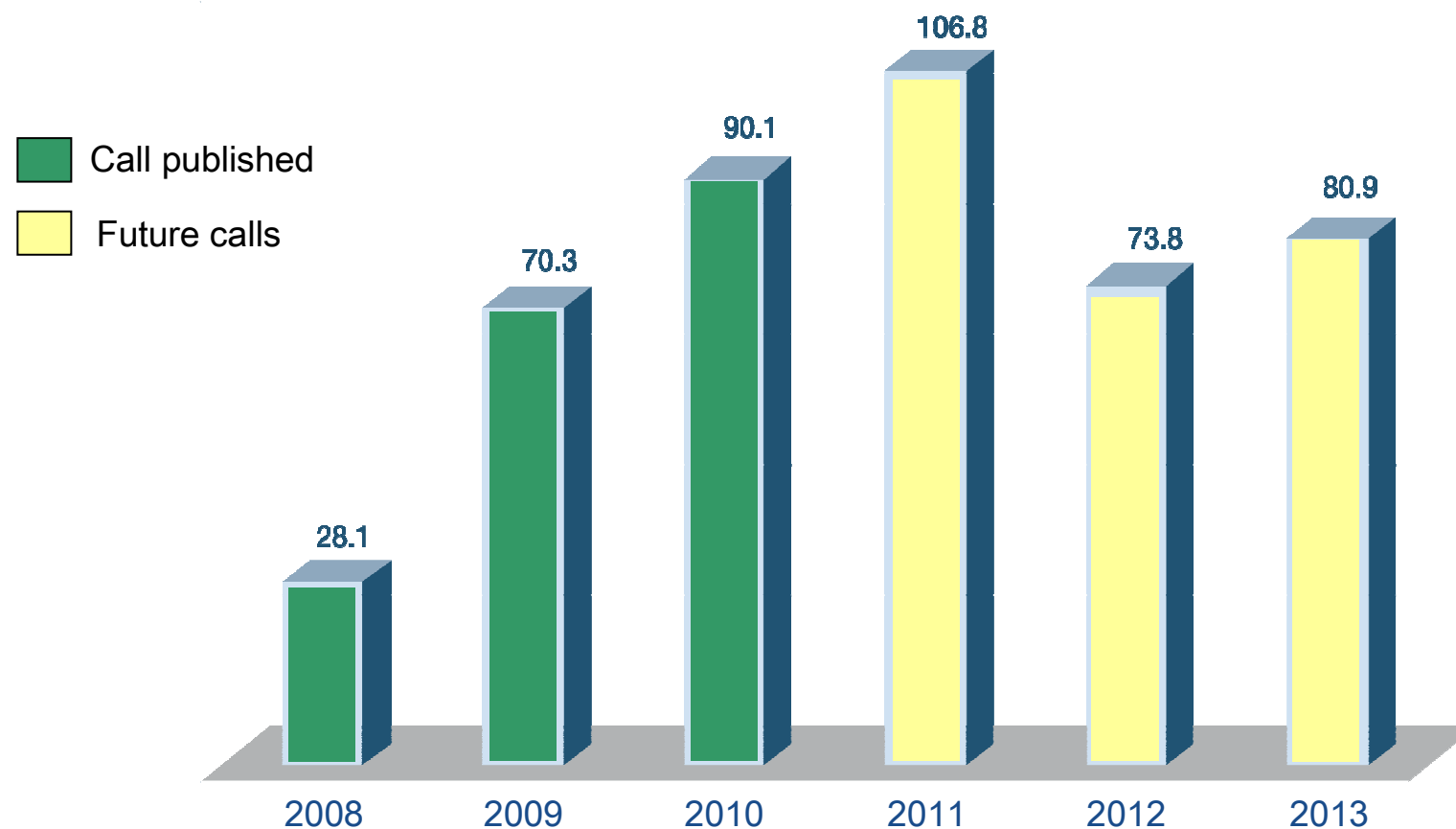

# Multi Annual Implementation Plan

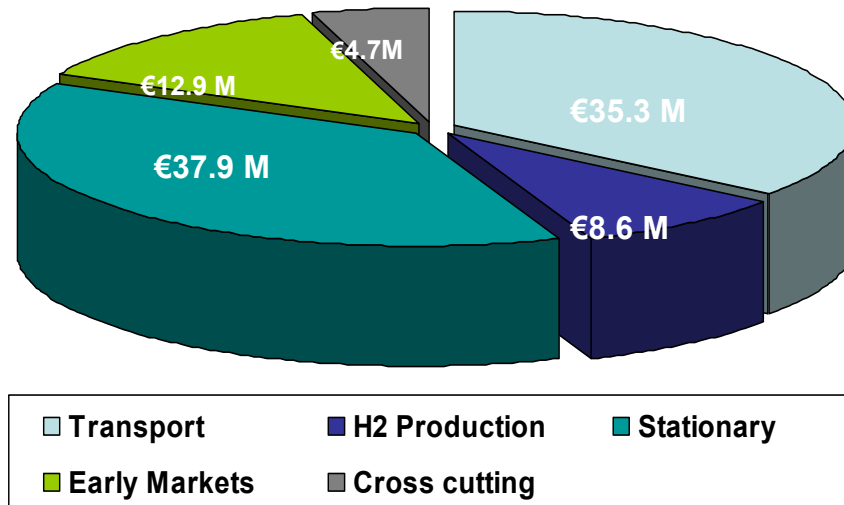
- Adopted by the GB on 15 May 2009

Budget: EUR 28.1 million  
16 projects were granted  
funding in December 2009

## Call 2009:

Budget: EUR 71.3 million  
50 Proposals received  
26 proposals into  
negotiations in April 2010

## Call 2010

Budget: EUR 90 million  
71 Proposals received

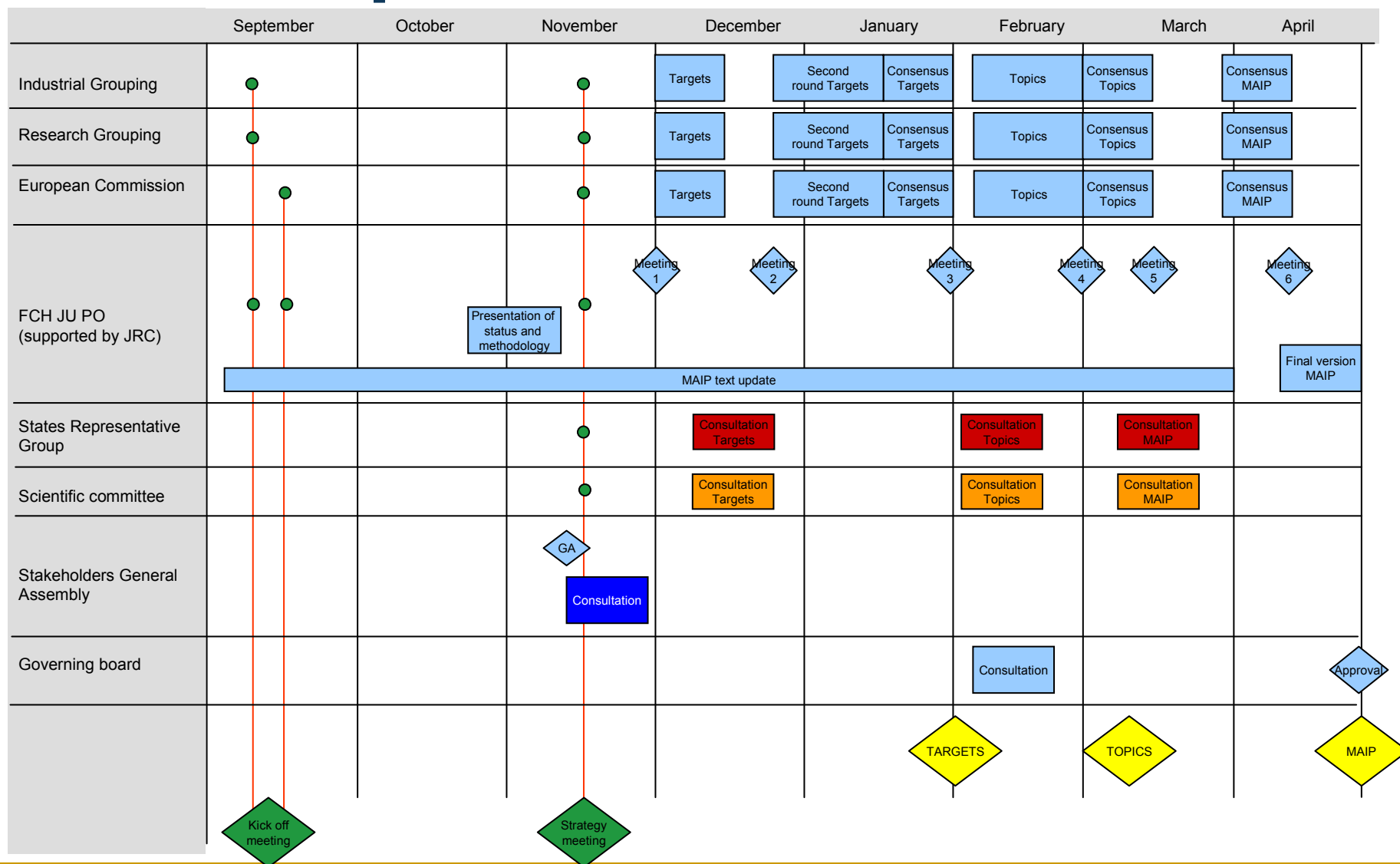

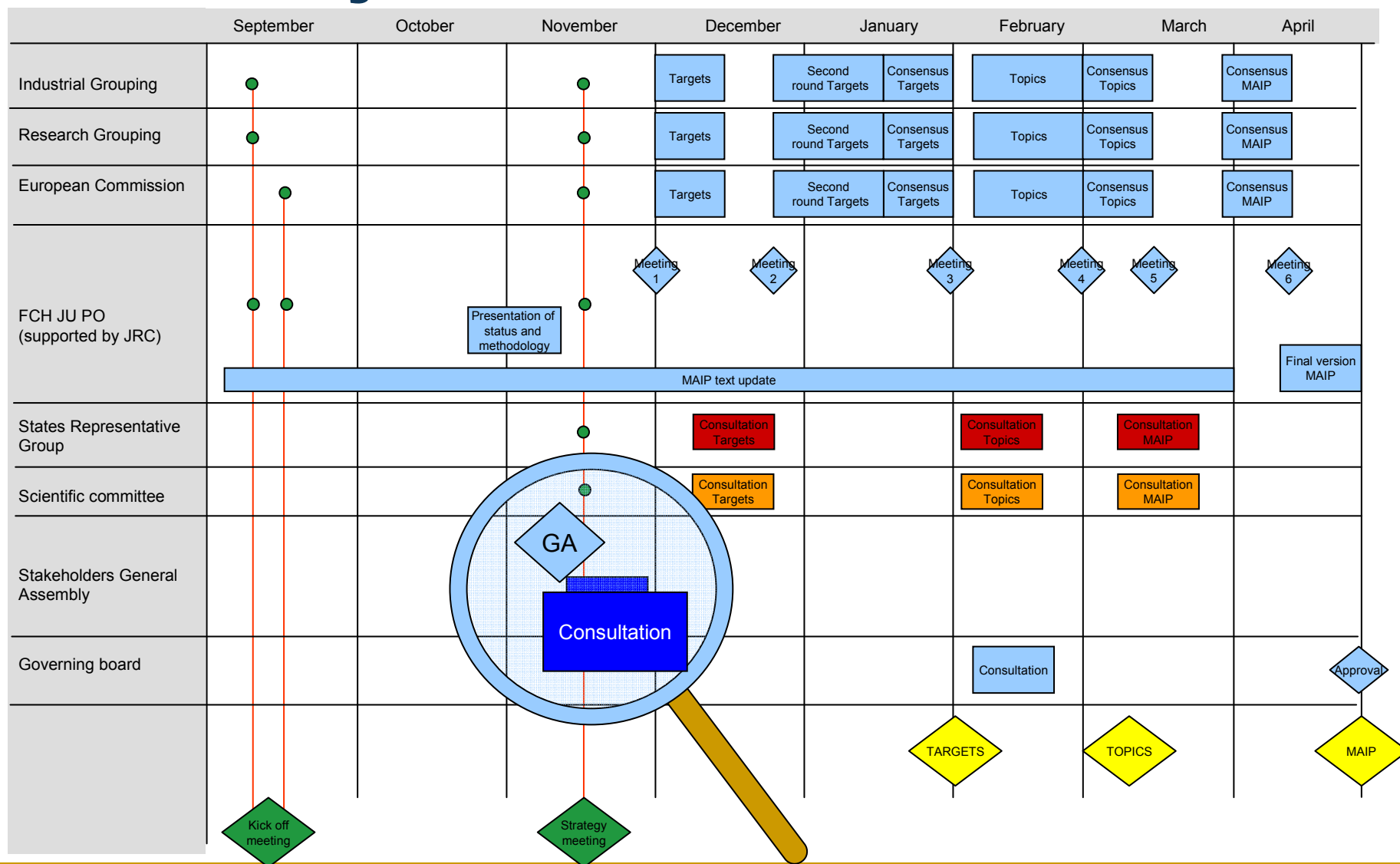
